CLOSING THE GAP: Achieving Equity in Kidney Transplantation



More than 96,000 people on the national transplant waiting list are waiting for a kidney.¹





Compared to deceased donor kidney transplants there were significant racial differences in receiving kidneys from living donors.²

Black people were **less likely** to get a kidney from a living donor.²



Hispanic people were less likely to get a kidney from a living donor.²

Living Kidney Donation Stories



What is living donation?

- Living donation offers a way to save a life by donating an organ while you're still alive. This can reduce the wait time for a transplant for those who might otherwise face a long and uncertain period on the deceased donor waitlist.
 - The average wait time for a deceased donor kidney is 3-5 years.⁵
 - On average, a kidney from a living donor lasts about 15 to 20 years.6
- In 2023, 6,257 lives were saved thanks to living kidney donors.7
