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#### II. Case log:

- REQUIRED: Fill the case log on Academic Universe.
- ADVISABLE: Start early and add cases periodically to avoid end of fellowship rush.
- ADVISABLE: Keep a log of ALL YOUR CASES, you will need them for many other reasons in the future.





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### National Transplant Curriculum:

- REQUIRED: Complete all required modules
- ADVISABLE: Start early and finish modules periodically to avoid end of fellowship rush

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- Required annual exam to assess fund of knowledge and clinical decision making (Test dates in April)
- Online test, proctored by PD or program coordinator
- 120 questions in 3 hours.
- Passing score is ≥50% correct for combined first and second year tests.
- Remediation options available if minimum score is not achieved (repeat exam and self-directed study)
- Survey at the end of each exam session helps FTC and TACC build the future of training.





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Milestone forms by PD

• 24 months of training (including 18 months of clinical training)



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## **REQUIRED:**

Fellows are responsible for requesting their Certificate of Completion at the end of their fellowship.

Fellows must also complete the Fellows Exit Survey.




## **Abdominal Transplant Surgeon Certification:**

Fellowship Certification Pathway

## ☐ Be eligible to apply for certification:

- 1. Complete a TACC Accredited Transplant Fellowship and receive a TACC Certificate of Completion
- 2. In practice for a minimum of one year at the time of the exam.
- Post-fellowship surgical logs from the inpractice period

☐ Pass the Oral Exam

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#### Managed Time Policy and fellows' well being:

- TACC requirements for accredited fellowship programs
  - One regional/national meeting attendance
  - Two weeks of vacation every year
  - One weekend off per month
  - Two additional 24-hour periods every month
- Discuss with PD how to schedule your vacation time, days off, conference attendance and fellows' symposium attendance.
- Discuss mechanisms to recognize and combat fatigue and exhaustion.





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#### FTC activities and resources

- Fellows' Symposium.
  - Fall of the second year.
  - Mandatory attendance does not count towards the fellows' vacation time or regional/national meeting requirement.
- FTC fellow member
  - Open for second year fellows


